News for 2008-2009:

- The Foundation gave over \$25,000 in scholarships to 24 Hanover County students.
- The Foundation raised \$414,932 in revenues and pledges.
- The Foundation awarded \$15,000 to fund grants and assist teachers in the classroom thanks to a grant from Altria.
- Michael Patrick, General Manager of Patrick Pontiac Buick GMC, presented Carol Beazley, Hanover Teacher of the Year, with the use of a new vehicle for one year also covering the maintenance and the insurance. The Supply Room Companies presented Carol with a \$2,000 gas allowance check for the year. This is the second year in a row that Patrick Pontiac and The Supply Room Companies have made these gifts. These gifts are a great example of the support that the Foundation receives from the community.
- The Verizon Foundation gave the Foundation \$24,000 to be used to support the Reading Olympics.

This piece of equipment is valued at \$12,800 and will be used to assist students to learn about innovative technology in the construction equipment industry.

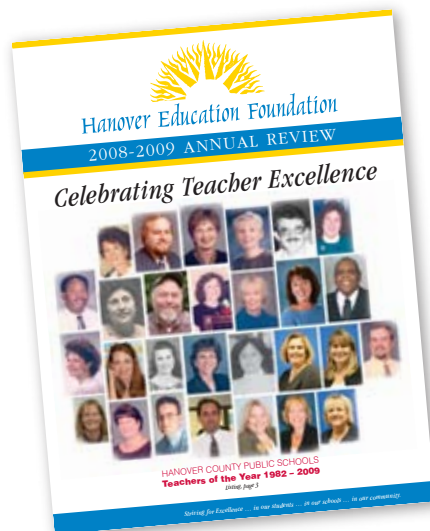

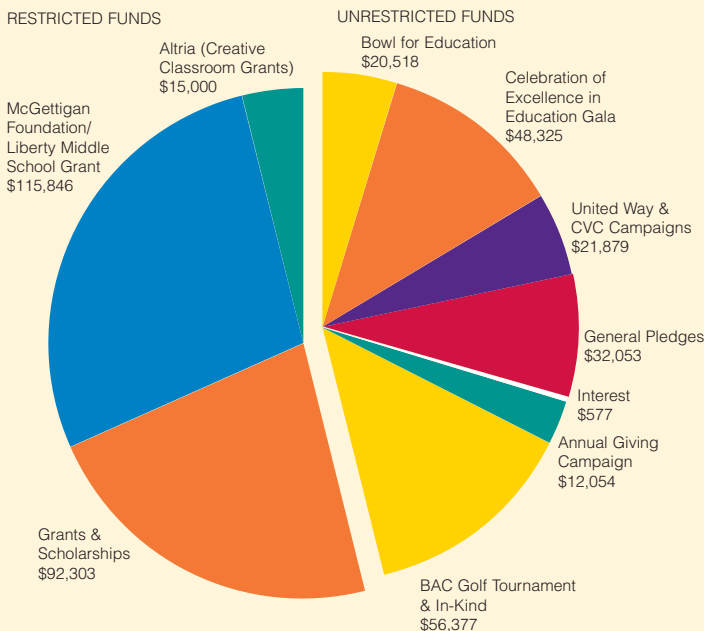

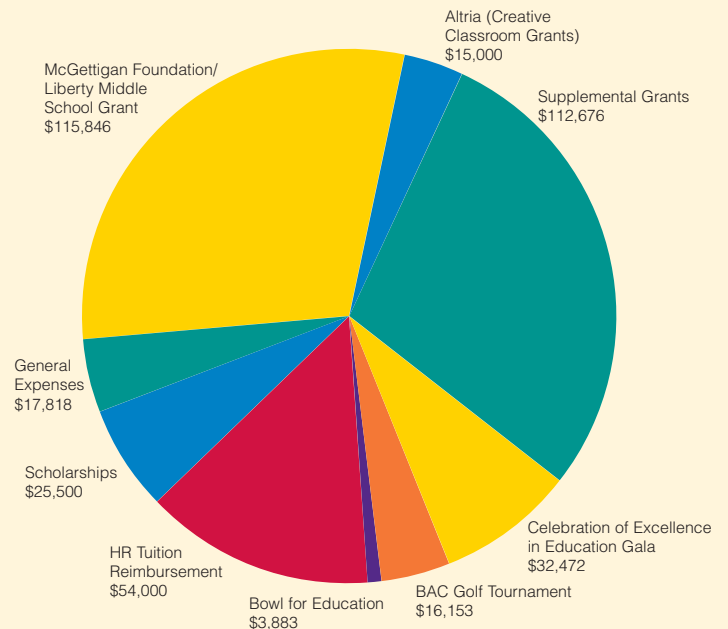
